<p>First Responder 40 hours</p>	<p>Knowledge and skills required by professional first responders. Includes Basic Life Support (BLS) and all content required by specific legislation.</p>	<p>Professionals in emergency medical care or those who are called upon to respond to someone experiencing an emergency.</p>
<p>Emergency Medical Responder 80 – 120 hours</p>	<p>The clinical knowledge and skills necessary to successfully function as part of an emergency response team. Responders learn to provide appropriate patient assessments, interventions and on-going care within their scope of practice.</p>	<p>Professionals in emergency medical care with a duty to act, usually within a formal emergency response organization such as fire response teams, emergency medical systems, paramedic services, tactical law enforcement officers.</p>
<p>Advanced First Aid 80 – 120 hours</p> <p>Based on jurisdiction</p>	<p>A comprehensive course offering advanced first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) skills required to provide appropriate patient assessments, interventions and ongoing care in the workplace.</p>	<p>Workplace first aid responders who typically function as part of an industrial or formal workplace response system.</p>
<p>Basic Life Support 4 – 6 hours</p> <p>Additional time required for add-on course options</p>	<p>A stand-alone or integrated high-quality cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) course, focusing on functioning as a high-performance team. Two add-on certifications are available: Oxygen Therapy and Airway Management.</p>	<p>In-facility care providers and pre-hospital care providers.</p>
<p>Psychological First Aid Online: 45 – 90 minutes* Classroom: 7 – 12 hours</p> <p>*Course lengths vary depending on the learner and the experience of the audience.</p>	<p>A resiliency-based wellness program that equips learners in developing a personal understanding of the effects of stress, loss, trauma and grief on themselves or others, with emphasis on self-care and personal protection. Online courses can be stand-alone or provide pre-course information for the classroom-based course.</p>	<p>Content can be customized to professional responders.</p>
